HR 2500 FY 2020 National Defense Authorization Act

Passed Jul 12th (220 yeas – 197 nays)

Amendment 680 which included a provision to repeal the widow's tax was passed prior to the final vote

Defense spending is authorized at \$733 billion

HR 3877 Bi-Partisan Budget Act 2019

Passed by the House July 25th (289 yeas – 149 nays)

Defense spending is set at \$738 billion in FY 2020 and \$740 billion in FY 2021, which are below the \$750 billion in the Senate version of the FY 2020 NDAA. The Bill also suspended the debt ceiling until July 31, 2021

Passed by the Senate August 1st (67 yeas -28 no) supported by a majority of Democrats -37 yeas

NOTE: Sen. Rubio voted no; Sen Scott stepped down from the chair to vote no

HR 2481 Gold Star Family Tax Relief Act
