Secretary's Report – March Board of Directors' Meeting

Secretary's Report – April 2, 2024 - Board of Directors Meeting

The April 2024 Board of Directors Meeting for the Halifax Chapter of MOAA met on April 2, 2024, at the Halifax Yacht Club, in Daytona Beach, FL. The meeting was called to order by Andrew Hoffman at 10 a.m.

The following board members (showed with an asterisk) and guests were present: Andrew Hoffman*, Bancroft McKittrick*, Tina Dixon-Bartlett*, Kim Ramos*, Lon Gardener*, Skip Keating*, Steve Maas*, Steve Becker, Joe Peabody, and Anita Williams.

Quorum requirements met.

Reports of Officers/Committees

The following items were discussed:

- 1. The minutes of the April Board of Directors meeting were distributed by email during the month. Acceptance of these was nominated, seconded, and approved via email.
- 2. Treasurer's Report Lon Gardener summarized the report and said that the current checking balance is \$ 6421.82. There is \$150 in petty cash, making a total balance of \$6571.82. There were several questions relating to the report. Lon will recheck the figures, correct the report, and send it out to the members for review and acceptance. Lon mentioned that he had received an invoice for \$2800 from Moldova, which he was unaware of. It was agreed that this was a fraud and should not be paid. Lon suggested a policy that two signatures are needed to pay unusual invoices.
- **3. Membership** Steve Becker stated that there were forty-one attendees at the monthly luncheon. He stated that the membership list shows 129 members; however, eighteen of those members were new cadets who signed up last year. He stated that he has been unable to contact them for their annual dues. It was agreed that we should remove them from the list. Drew said that we get \$10 from National for each new member, so we will continue to encourage them to join our chapter. Steve mentioned that an email, regarding dues, stated a fee for paper membership, however that was changed a couple of years ago.
- **4. Officer Call Report** Joe reported that he is learning the process for creating the monthly Officer Call newsletter and Pierre is helping him. He announced that April's Cadet Dinner will only cost \$27. Drew confirmed this is the price, per the club manager.
- **5. Surviving Spouse Update** Patti was not at the meeting.

Old Business.

- **6. Bagels and Bingo** Skip stated that they met yesterday and there were eighteen veterans, and nine volunteers, of which two were Daughters of the American Revolution members. He also stated that there will be a Volunteers Luncheon at Emory Bennett on April 17th. Skip reported that we have received a thank-you card from the Barracks of Hope for the rolling medicine cabinet. This activity occurs at Emory Bennett Veterans Nursing Home in Daytona Beach at 10 am on the first Monday of each month.
- 7. VCVC Update Skip Keating reported that new Bingo cards had been purchased. And, that the Knights of Columbus had purchased the eight wooden chairs that had been needed. This organization meets on the third Saturday of the month.
- **8. VA Coffee and Donuts** This activity is "on hold" until the VA Clinic has relocated.

New Business.

- **9. Outstanding Dues** Steve passed out a letter for review. The letter will go out to members who still owe dues. It was reviewed and all agreed that the letter was ready to be sent and will state the last date to renew is April 30.
- **10. Membership List** Anita stated that updating the membership list is going well. When she has completed the list, it will be sent to Steve and Jon. She will be meeting with Pierre to get familiar with managing the webmaster process. Drew mentioned that FCOC is transitioning to a new Website.
- 11. Baseball Game Outing Kim stated that we have thirty seats reserved for April 14 at 5 p.m. and 34 folks have already signed up. She will reserve an additional ten seats. Fifteen of our seats are reserved by Team Red, White & Blue. The tickets are \$11, and we will be sitting behind first base.
- 12. Halifax Gala Chair Drew stated that we still do not have a chairperson for the holiday gala. He stated that he has asked several members if they would be able to perform this job, but so far no one has accepted. Drew mentioned that we may not be able to have a gala if there is no chairperson. Kim suggested that we use the same format that we used for the April dinner. Everyone agreed that was a great idea. Lon will contact

the DJ for cost and Drew will collaborate with the club to create the menu. The attire will be formal. We will have the installation of officers and we will have dancing.

- **13. Outstanding Vendors**—Bancroft stated that the winner of the non-profit vendor's award is Vitas. The committee will meet this Friday to choose the "for-profit" Outstanding Support to Veterans Award. The award will be presented at the May Luncheon Meeting.
- **14. FCOC** Pierre is one of MOAA's "Advocacy in Action" members and he will be in D.C. on April 14, 2024, for that meeting. He will also be the speaker at the Memorial Day service in Ormond Beach.
- 15. Fourth of July Parade our chapter will be in the Volusia 4th of July parade. All are welcome to Participate.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:40 a.m. Our next meeting is on May 7, 2024, HRYC.

Legislative Affairs/National MOAA Advocacy in Action


MOAA's annual signature legislative event, Advocacy in Action (AiA), took place on Capitol Hill on April 17th. Team Florida took the lead in meeting with our twenty-eight elected Congressional Representatives or their staffers. The five Florida teams were headed by Steve Bond, the Vice President of the Florida Council; John Murphy, the incoming Vice President of the Council; Pierre Louis, the Chair of Council Legislative Affairs; Tony LaVecchia, the Area Vice President for NE Florida; and Dan Hill, the Area Vice President for Mid-Central Florida. They were supported by MOAA Board Members Marc Oliveri, Rick Buchanan, and Mike Hewett, as well as MOAA Virtual Chapter Representatives Joe Gollasch and Stephanie Rose. Our team served as the representative of the thirty-eight Florida chapters and the entire membership of 38,000 MOAA members in Florida. Our objective was to champion the rights of all veterans and their families, ensure that the commitments made to veterans are upheld, and showcase the formidable influence of MOAA through its large membership.

Participating in the AiA efforts on Capitol Hill and witnessing the direct outcomes of our combined advocacy endeavors was exhilarating. I took great pride in actively contributing to the preservation of earned benefits for veterans and their families. New Daytona VA Clinic

The new Daytona Beach VA clinic represents a concerted effort by the VA to meet expectations for a growing community of Veterans in this area. On Thursday, community leaders, administrators & Veterans got to see the finished product: over 133,000-square-foot, tech-equipped building at 1776 N. Williamson Blvd with the capacity to treat as many as 30,000 patients in numerous areas of care. This beautiful new clinic officially opens its doors May 13.

The Clinic includes 23 departments such as dental, primary care, vision, laboratory, physical therapy & pharmacy. It will also house the homeless program & specialty services like cardiovascular diagnostics, neurology, vascular, chiropractic and orthopedics. Florida Sen Tom Wright said it is the 5th largest VA clinic in the world, and there is room for expansion. The facility is open to all Veterans, not just those from Volusia County. Patients will be accepted beginning 13 May. The clinic's regular operating hours (0800-1630, Monday-Friday) will remain the same.

The Power of Prevention: Get Cancer Screenings With TRICARE

According to the <u>Centers for Disease Control and Prevention</u>, catching cancer early is one of the best ways to protect yourself and your loved ones from cancer. That's where routine <u>cancer screenings</u> come in. Screening tests can find many common cancers before they cause symptoms. If you've been putting off a screening that's recommended for you, it's time to make it a priority.

TRICARE covers a wide range of cancer screenings at no cost to you when you follow your plan's rules for getting preventive care. Recommended cancer screenings depend on your age, sex, and risk factors.



For women, TRICARE covers: <u>Mammograms</u>, usually starting at age 40 and <u>Pap tests</u> starting at age 21. For men, TRICARE covers: <u>Prostate cancer exams</u>, usually starting at age 50 and <u>Testicular exams</u> for men ages 13-39 with certain risk factors.

For both men and women, TRICARE covers: <u>Colorectal cancer tests</u> starting at age 45, <u>Lung cancer screening</u> for certain smokers ages 50-80, <u>Oral cancer exams</u> for adults at increased risk due to tobacco or alcohol use, <u>Skin cancer exams</u> for people with certain risk factors including family history and frequent sun exposure, and <u>Thyroid cancer exams</u> for adults exposed to radiation.

If you show signs or symptoms that could mean cancer, see your doctor as soon as possible. Preventive screenings can help find cancer early, when it's most treatable. Please take advantage of these covered screenings. They could save your life.
