MOAA's 2024 Legislative Priorities for the 118th Congress

As the legislative slate is wiped clean for the 118th Congress in 2024, your support becomes even more vital to achieving MOAA's advocacy objectives.

MOAA needs your help to keep momentum for existing priorities such as the Major Richard Star Act, which would benefit tens of thousands of combat-injured veterans and had the support of two-thirds of Congress at the end of last session. They also need your help on behalf of new objectives and emergent issues, often via immediate action to keep up with the stop-and-go pace of legislation.

Here is a list of MOAA's priorities, in support of the 50th anniversary of our all-volunteer force and to address the challenges facing our uniformed community. Note: MOAA's advocacy team remains active on many other issues not listed here; MOAA priorities will be shaped throughout the year depending on concurrent successes or emerging issues. Additionally, we share many interests with The Military Coalition and other stakeholder groups, and leverage those relationships to expand our reach on Capitol Hill.

Guest Speaker's Bio -



STEPHEN J. (Steve) BOND Colonel, United States Army, RET Melbourne, FL / 321-831-7572

Steve is a retired Colonel and a 29year veteran of the United States Army. He is currently the Senior Vice

President of the Military Officers Association of America (MOAA) Florida Council and a Past President of the MOAA Cape Canaveral Chapter (MOAACC). He was initially commissioned as a Second Lieutenant through the ROTC program. He joined the Army for adventure and to travel around the world--He accomplished that goal!

Over his military career, Steve led and commanded units from the Lieutenant (O-1) level as an Airborne Infantry Platoon Leader with 40 soldiers assigned, to the Colonel (O-6) level leading over 450+ assigned soldiers. He also served in key staff positions in Airborne, Infantry, Military Intelligence, Special Operations, and Joint Commands. Steve is a veteran of combat operations in Panama (1989-90) and Saudi Arabia/Kuwait (1990-91), as well as humanitarian/peacekeeping operations in St. Croix (1989), and Haiti (1994). He was assigned to posts across the United States, and in Italy, Germany and Japan. He is a Military Jumpmaster-Master Parachutist, and Ranger qualified.

After Steve retired from the Army, he worked for one of the largest Defense-Aerospace Companies in the US as a Director of Business Development in Melbourne, FL from 2004-08, and again from 2009-17. There he worked closely with military customers and provided advice to the program and engineering teams developing equipment and systems for the military.

From February 2008 to March 2009, Steve served in a US Government Senior Executive Service (SES) Flag/General Officer-position as the Director of the Intelligence Transition Team and Senior US Intelligence Advisor to the Iraqi Ministries of Defense (MOD), Interior (MOI), and Counter-Terrorist Force while assigned to the Multi-National Security Transition Command-Iraq (MNSTC-I), Multi-National Force -Iraq (MNF-I) during Operation Iraqi Freedom in

what was known as "The Surge". There he led a 130-member team of US Soldiers, Sailors, Airmen, Marines, Government and Contract Civilians, and worked with National Intelligence Agencies and key coalition partners to advise and assist Iraqi Intelligence organizations to improve their performance and capabilities and expedite the departure of US Forces from Iraq.

He holds a master's degree in history from the University of Kansas, and a bachelor's degree in history from the University of Utah. His military education includes the Army Command and General Staff College, and the Army War College. His military awards include the Defense Superior Service Medal, the Legion of Merit, the Bronze Star Medal, among others. For his civilian service in Iraq, he was awarded the Department of the Army Meritorious Civilian Service Medal and the Global War on Terror Civilian Service Medal.

Steve lives in Melbourne and enjoys the Florida weather by running, biking, and swimming. He also enjoys travelling for snow skiing in the winter.
