January Program/Speaker Dr. Alvin Jackson

Dr. Alvin Jackson holds a Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of Maryland in College Park, MD, as well as Masters and Doctorate of Ministry Degrees from The Thomas Brown Bible College in Jacksonville, FL. He is, also, the author of the book *It Is Another Great Day: An Inspiring Guide to Effective Leadership*.

Dr. Jackson is presently serving as the City Manager for Bunnell, FL. Bunnell is the second largest city, in land area, in the State of Florida with over 89 thousand acres within the city limits (majority agriculture). He is strategic and results-driven, focused on achieving exceptional results for administrative and operational functions in growth-oriented environments that demand continuous improvement. He possesses more than 38 years leading in municipal, state, economic development and workforce initiatives and agencies. A customer-focused leader possessing a unique blend of marketing, business, and financial strengths, he has spearheaded numerous breakthroughs and innovative accomplishments throughout his career that have touched lives of people.

Alvin spent the previous four years as Suwannee County Economic Development Director, providing strategic oversight and effectively leading the organization to new levels of efficiency and success. During his tenure in Suwannee, he directed the recruitment and expansion of 21 companies that drove more than \$166 million in capital investment, creating over 800 new jobs, drafted a performance-based Business Incentive Program which drove an additional creation of over 650 jobs for an investment of \$5.2 million dollars in performance-based incentives. In addition, Alvin recommended and created a new Land Use category, titled "Employment Centers" which would accommodate a mixed use of business, industrial, manufacturing, commercial, retail and limited residential properties. At the end of his tenure, he secured \$3.2 million to construct a wastewater treatment infrastructure at the hottest sites in the region.

Yes, We Have Some Bananas.

A friend of mine, a retired Navy Chief Hospital Corpsman, recounts the following story:



"I was on board the USS Boston CAG-1 in 1962 for the Cuban Missile Crisis. Our mission was to stop any ships suspected of carrying any missiles or missile parts into Cuba. We sent out a crews of 10 sailors from the Boston, heavily armed to do a complete search of the vessels. A Hospital Corpsman was sent out with each surveillance crew carrying a 45-caliber pistol. The call to assemble and search was, "Away the Surveillance Detail."

I participated in 10 details, and we never found any missiles, only bananas. We didn't remove the bananas to see what was in the bottom of the crates. We saw bananas, turned around and headed back to the ship. We didn't want to start any conflict."


